CANDIDATES' GENERAL INFORMATION

- The College Certificates, with the exception of the TeachingDiploma, are comprised of three, separately assessed sections:
 - Theory of Music,
 - Music Writing, and
 - Playing.
- For "Theory of Music" and "Music Writing", all questions should be attempted and must be answered in the Examination Booklet, which will be provided by the Examiner.
- Seventy Five percent(75%), is the pass mark requirement in each of the three sections of the College Examinations.
- Fees for the College examinations will be collected by the State Branch, and may be varied from time-to-time by the Australian Pipe Band Association.

If a candidate is unsuccessful in any <u>one</u> section of an examination, then that section may be re-examined, however, another examination fee will be charged. The re-test must becompleted within a reasonable time.
